

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE WILLEM FABER, MAI

Dear Members and Friends,

Fall is here and with it the last quarter of 2023. September was by far the busiest month for our chapter with both the Central Florida Real Estate Forum and the regional meetings in Louisville. The Appraisal Institute is

making major and exciting changes including rebranding under the leadership of our new CEO – Cindy Chance. There are many other plans in store, so now is the time to get involved!

While some appraisers still have a full schedule of work, others may currently be experiencing a slowdown. Times like these present great opportunities to prepare for the future by taking education courses, re-evaluating business plans and operations, expanding your client base, volunteering for our chapter, or enhancing technology skills. These are important tasks that often get pushed to the side during busy times. As with every market cycle, the upside is in front of us. Many are predicting a wave of workouts and appraisal work coming. Did you know that most commercial real estate assets get appraised about once every five years, typically when they sell or refinance? However, during down cycles there are additional opportunities for an appraisal. Once an asset goes into default, the bank must get an appraisal, and depending on the size of the loan, the bank will have to get it appraised every six months during the disposition or workout cycle which is usually 18 to 24 months. The value-add buyer will then need an appraisal from a new lender and another after they turn the asset around in 12 to 18 months to get their equity out in a sale. So, a troubled asset can generate five or six appraisals in a five-year period. Invest in yourself and your chapter in the short term, so that you will be prepared for good times ahead.

Our chapter has several education opportunities to be on the lookout for. One such course- Capital Reserves Studies: A Business Opportunity for Appraisers taught by Patricia Staebler, SRA was on October 26th, and there are two more offerings before the end of the year:

<u>Aerial Inspections for Real Estate Appraisers</u> (Virtual) taught by Lamar Ellis, III, MAI, SRA on November 30th; and

<u>Three Hour Florida Law</u> (Virtual) taught by Nicholas Pilz, MAI, SRA, AI-RRS on December 14th
